What is it all about?

This small- and large-group event provides a platform to discuss questions on the ‘rigour’ of inter- and transdisciplinary (itd) methods with theorists and practitioners around the world. We base the discussion on the assumption that inter- and transdisciplinarians need to justify the validity, trustworthiness, utility, and overall appropriateness of their methods. We are challenged to establish robust and coherent descriptions of methods, to enhance the traceability of itd methods and to establish joint quality criteria.

Guided by discussion questions, we will explore how we express our commitment to ‘rigour’ in itd research, generate guidance for choosing and documenting the application of methods, as well as join our forces to enhance the acknowledgment of itd methods within academia.

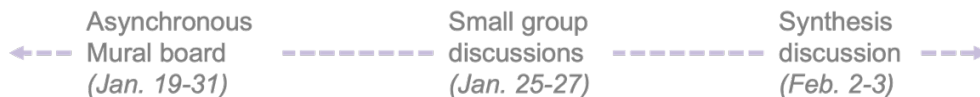
The goal of our discussions is to generate a list of key questions that must be researched or problems that must be solved to advance future conversations on ‘rigour’ of itd methods. Participants will be invited to form groups to start addressing these questions and problems.

Who participates?

We invite anyone involved in developing and/or critically reflecting on methods for inter- and transdisciplinarity. We also seek dialogue with allied approaches such as participatory research, mode 2 science, etc.; being attentive to commonalities and differences between these approaches.
