

## Interdisciplinary science research university rankings released

Times Higher Education released the inaugural results for the top ranked universities for interdisciplinary science research on November 21. The results can be found at: <u>https://www.timeshighereducation.com/news/interdisciplinary-science-rankings-2025-results-announced</u>. While all rankings have problems, the release of the rankings is another sign that ITD research is moving into the mainstream. Interestingly, the ten countries with the most institutions in the top 200 are: USA (21), India (15), Italy (14), Saudi Arabia (12), Türkiye (10), China (9), Japan (8), Egypt (7), Taiwan (6) and Thailand (6).


# Call for individual presentations, Conference for Advancing Participatory Sciences (CAPS 2025), 27-30 May, Portland, Orgegon, USA
