You are warmly invited to join us for this event, and we're excited to hear about the topics and ideas you bring! We're looking forward to meeting you!


Quality & Rigour Discussion Session, February 10, 2025, 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM CET, online (live meeting).

In this session, the <u>Quality and Rigour Project</u> within the Toolkits & Methods working group invites participants to explore which quality and rigor criteria from traditional research methods can be applied to ITD methods, which may not be applicable, and which might require adaptation. Additionally, we will consider whether entirely new quality criteria are needed for ITD methods, beyond those used for traditional research methods. We will conclude with a discussion on the project's next steps.

Team Science Champions Program pilot launches in Ethiopia, January 2025

A two-year Team Science Champions Program pilot will be launched in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, at the end of January 2025. The first cohort of investigators and staff to serve as Team Science Champions will spend their first year learning the fundamentals of Team Science and in the second year will begin serving as Team Science Trainers in their own organizations. In this way they'll contribute to building infrastructure for Team Science and create cultures of collaboration for team-based interdisciplinary research at their institutions. The pilot program will be undertaken as part of the Ethiopia-Emory Tuberculosis Research Training Program (EETB-RTP) which trains promising Ethiopian investigators from Addis Ababa University (AAU), Armauer Hansen Research Institute (AHRI), and the Ethiopian Public Health Institute (EPHI) in interdisciplinary research preparing them to become the next generation of internationally recognized TB investigators who are also translating research findings into practice. The Team Science training will be undertaken by L. Michelle Bennett, working collaboratively with Henry Blumberg (Emory), Russell Kempker (Emory), Kidist Bobosha (AHRI), Damen Hailemariam (AAU), and Saro Abdella (EHPI).
