**Description:** This entry in the Encyclopedia on Inter- and Transdisciplinarity outlines transdisciplinary research as a collaborative process between researchers and societal actors to address real-world problems. It introduces a three-phase model—problem framing, generation of integrated knowledge, and integrative assessment—highlighting the importance of integration, adaptability, reflexivity, and tailoring processes to context-specific transformative goals.

**Description:** This entry in the Encyclopedia on Inter- and Transdisciplinarity emphasizes the critical role of integration in addressing complex societal problems. It explores how integration connects diverse knowledge systems and entities, supports methodological creativity, and fosters collaboration across cognitive, social, and communicative dimensions. The entry outlines strategies for creating socially robust, scientifically rigorous outcomes tailored to specific project contexts.



### Call for Contributions, Tour d'Horizon 2024 compilation of most important ITD publications, td-net


Your recommendation counts! Which publications from 2024 do you consider to be the most relevant, innovative, and/or provocative in the field of inter- and transdisciplinarity?

Call for papers, Interdisciplinary Learning and Teaching Conference, 'Interdisciplinary Integration: Engaging students with Interdisciplinary Thinking and Doing', 10 April 2025, London, UK

This year's Interdisciplinary Learning and Teaching Conference conference is scheduled for 10 April 2025 and will be hosted by the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE). It explores how to engage students in interdisciplinary thinking, focusing on methods that challenge traditional subject-focused education. It invites practical approaches to making interdisciplinary activities meaningful and valuable for students in today's marketised educational context.

#### Themes include:

- Creating opportunities for interdisciplinary activities
- Places for interdisciplinary learning and teaching
- Outcomes from interdisciplinary opportunities and engagement

Formats: Short papers (15 minutes), lightning talks (5 minutes), and problem-focused workshops.

The <u>2025 International Action Learning Conference</u> will be hosted by Alliance Manchester Business School (AMBS), University of Manchester from 7-9 April 2025 in Manchester, UK. The theme is "Creating the conditions for developing people and organisations" with a focus on two areas in particular:

- Collective capability action learning has a tradition of people interacting and working together to achieve 'something'. Collective capability describes those 'somethings' as being delivered through a process of collective agency. Papers are welcomed on action learning and how it supports that focus of collective capability/agency/leadership.
- Action learning as an agent in leadership development action learning is used throughout many industries as an agent for development of leaders. Please share papers on how action learning supports or is the key component of leadership development within programmes or as one-off activities.
