Report on workshop to collect team science training resources, including toolkits – a collaboration with ACTS and INSciTS

The Toolkits & Methods Working Group, with ACTS (Association for Clinical and Translational Science), continues to support an INSciTS (International Network for the Science of Team Science) effort to collect team science training resources, including toolkits. On January 10th, the INSciTS team hosted a workshop with 15-20 attendees to discuss user-friendly categorization of training resources using a Miro board. Key topics included toolkit definitions, inclusion standards, and useful tags. Next, two additional meetings will refine outcomes with global participation to develop an organized inventory. 


