He has served in public, private, academic, and civil society sectors and is actively involved in the Nigerian Association of Evaluators, ITD Alliance, AfroPHC, and CSDI-Network and AfreeHealth among others. His research focuses on transdisciplinary collaborations for environmental change and public health.

He lectures at <u>Federal University Dutse (FUD)</u>, Nigeria, and formerly in Kampala International University (KIU), Uganda, and coordinates the African Hub of planetary Health Alliance. He has published widely, presented at global conferences, and is passionate about climate change and health, sustainable development, and community engagement.
