

Agenda and important information for the ITD Alliance 26 and 27 June 2025 General Assembly

The annual General Assembly is an important opportunity for members to participate in building a strong, effective and representative association for both institutional and individual members.

ITD Alliance members were sent an email on 4 June 2025 with the agenda and important information about the 26 and 27 June 2025 General Assembly (Bylaws). *If you believe you are a member and did not receive the email, please contact Executive Secretary, Caryn Anderson (caryn.anderson@itd-alliance.org), to ensure your membership is current.*

The 26 and 27 June 2025 General Assembly (Bylaws) will deal with proposed updates to the bylaws, involving both changes and clarifications. There is also an opportunity to review and discuss the procedures through which the bylaws are implemented by the Leadership Board. The procedures are being gathered together in a single public document as an aid to corporate memory and to foster clarity and transparency. These updates reflect the growth and evolution of the ITD Alliance and are designed to strengthen its foundations. They also lay necessary groundwork for the Leadership Board elections at the second General Assembly, scheduled for October.

The web page for the <u>26 and 27 June 2025 General Assembly (Bylaws)</u> meetings includes the exact meeting times, Zoom link, other key dates, agenda and papers, and voting details. Recordings and slides will also be posted on the page after the meetings.

ITD Alliance General Assembly meetings scheduled for 26 & 27 June and 9 & 10 October 2025

There will be two General Assemblies in 2025, each with two online meetings to accommodate global time zones. The first on 26 and 27 June is described above. The second on 9 and 10 October will be for financial and other reporting, as well as elections to the Leadership Board. There will be a two week online voting period following each set of meetings. 
Leadership Board meetings are held every month, with two meetings covering different time zones, allowing everyone to attend at a reasonably convenient time. Since the report in the March News Bulletin, the Leadership Board has:

- extensively discussed and finalised the proposed bylaw changes and clarifications for the June General Assembly (the agenda and agenda papers have now been sent to all members)
- started a process of discussing and planning actions stemming from five regional TD training needs workshops (organized with, and funded by, the TD Training Collaboratory). The synthesis report "Advancing Engaged Research Globally – Region by Region: Assessing Training Needs" (which is the basis for these discussions) is available on the ITD Alliance website at: <u>https://itdalliance.org/resources/advancing-engaged-research-globally/</u>
- appointed the University of Évora in Portugal as the host for ITD27, the 2027 International Inter- and Transdisciplinarity conference
- authorised the President to hold discussions with other organisations (in Latin America, China and the USA) interested in partnering with the ITD Alliance to run events

- started a process of writing welcome sentences in languages other than English for the ITD Alliance website (see <u>https://itd-alliance.org/</u>; additional contributions from ITD Alliance members are also welcome)
- organised a second successful webinar, led by Leadership Board member, Umar Ibrahim
- continued to share strategies for recruiting new members this is a standing item on the Leadership Board meetings agenda. To date this financial year, beginning 1 September 2024, there have been 4 new institutional members and 50 new individual members, with 2 institutional members not renewing and 16 individual members not renewing.

The Leadership Board is also delighted to announce that Umar Ibrahim has joined the Executive Committee, replacing Helena Guimarães, who was an outstanding contributor for the last two or so years.

Learning from Paulo Freire for transformative, inter- and transdisciplinary research [description for series of 3 publications]

Open access versions of all three publications were made available in June 2025.

In a series of publications – two special issues (in English) and a volume (in Spanish) – 16 authors from Latin America and Europe revisit the work of Brazilian educator Paulo Freire to mobilise it for inter- and transdisciplinary research and learning today. What can we learn from a Brazilian educator who dedicated his life to the liberation from oppression? Paulo Freire's approach to research and learning incorporates ground-breaking principles for individual and social transformation. The idea of learning 'to read and to write the world' that is at the bottom of his literacy approach offers a fresh perspective on inter- and transdisciplinary research. Freire's approach also challenges techno-scientific discourses with its profound ethical-political claim.



Professorship, "Living Labs in Agricultural Landscapes (W3)", School of Sustainability at Leuphana University Lüneburg and the Leibniz Centre for Agricultural Landscape Research (ZALF), Germany
