General Assembly Meetings – Report, Recordings and Slides

The sixth General Assembly of the ITD Alliance included two identical online meetings on 9 and 10 October 2025 (depending on time zone). There were 24 and 13 attendees, respectively, and the meetings provided an opportunity for lively exchange and discussion.

The meetings were an opportunity to hear from, and recognise, the valuable work of volunteers serving on the Leadership Board, coordinating the working groups, and organising the ITD27 conference. The work described was impressive, tackling critical issues for inter- and transdisciplinarity and for the ITD Alliance.

The financial report highlighted that the ITD Alliance is living within its means, along with the importance of raising additional revenue to allow the Executive Secretary to expand the essential and much-appreciated support she provides.

A priority for the next 12 months is increasing membership to grow the number of volunteers; expand global links, especially to under-represented countries; and raise income. All members are invited to help.

Workshop Format:


- The Common Room: Connecting, touching base and sharing.

HKBU's project *Institutionalising Transdisciplinary Education for Addressing SDG-driven Challenges* has been shortlisted for the prestigious <u>QS Reimagine Education Awards</u> in the *Sustainability Education Literacy* category. Over 1,600 submissions were received across 18 diverse categories in 2025. Awards will be announced at the <u>Reimagine Education Conference</u> in London from 1-3 December 2025.

Description: Tuberculosis remains a significant public health challenge in Nigeria. Integrating AI especially the Transdisciplinary further development of Artificial General Intelligence – Transdisciplinary AI into TB management offers promising results. Ethical and human-centred concerns are critical to ensure responsible deployment. This study investigates ethical artificial intelligence integration in tuberculosis management in Nigeria.

It uses a matrix of differences as a framework for analyzing the impact of training activities on the integrative consciousness of individuals and the integrative capacity of collectives (e.g., teams).

Description: In this paper, the authors discuss the complex communication strategy developed for the Woody Weeds project, a transdisciplinary project that focused on woody invasive plants in eastern Africa. The strategy included 17 activities designed to support communication among scientists, students, and stakeholders from the project's inception to its conclusion. The paper analyzes the informational and relational aspects of these activities and the overall effectiveness of the strategy, offering it as a guide to enhancing communication and the success of large TDSS projects.



It shows how interdisciplinarity has been misunderstood to fit existing structures and argues that genuine integrative practice requires informed leadership, investment in pedagogical and organisational expertise, and deeper structural changes.
