Report and Recording, ITD Value Project Inaugural Workshop, 28 October 2025

On 28 October 2025, 18 participants from across Europe, Africa, Asia, and Australia joined an online workshop to kick off the ITD Value Project, a project of the Integration Experts and Expertise working group of the ITD Alliance. Facilitated by Claes-Fredrik Helgesson, Giedre Kligyte, and Helena Grönqvist, the session focused on a big question: how do we make integration expertise visible and valued? The group explored challenges like the lack of understanding of integration work, missing career paths, and resourcing gaps, and brainstormed opportunities, from creating clearer integrator role profiles to different modes of dialogue and advocacy. Next steps include drafting a roadmap, and progressing a range of 'quick wins', such as mapping the demand for integration, and developing integrator personas and case study examples. Sub-groups will take these ideas forward into 2026.

The <u>ITD PhD Supervision Guide</u> synthesizes scholarly discussions and experiences on ITD supervision challenges and insights, and provides questions for discussion and reflection, enabling doctoral researchers and their supervisors to exchange ideas, enhance communication, and navigate the complexities of the PhD journey together.



This collection explores how transdisciplinary research—crossing disciplinary and societal boundaries—coproduces transformative knowledge to drive real-world change. Contributions are welcome on:

Call for sessions, Towards a just and habitable world: exploring the role of technology, University of Lausanne, Switzerland, 2–5 June 2026

The call for sessions is now open for the European conference Towards a just and habitable world: exploring the role of technology, taking place at the University of Lausanne, Switzerland on 2–5 June 2026 in cooperation with the Centre des Politiques de la Terre (Université Paris-Cité) and the Future Earth Pathways Initiative. The conference's aim is to open a critical conversation on how we might transform technological systems toward sufficiency, equity, and resilience. The conference will explore technological systems in all their diversity — from water and energy infrastructures, agroecology and nature-based solutions to synthetic biology, and digital technologies. Which technologies can foster well-being within planetary and local boundaries, and which of them carry the risk of exacerbating ecological overshoot and social injustice? How do we navigate

between illusions of high-tech salvation and the urgent need for democratic, grounded and large-scale responses to the hard limits of adaptation?

Session proposals are welcome for thematic sessions, workshops, cultural events, and poster presentations. With inter- and transdisciplinarity at the heart of this conference, we encourage collaborations between researchers from across the natural and social sciences, engineering, and the humanities, as well as scholars and practitioners engaged in inter- and transdisciplinary research.
