## ITD Alliance events

### **Philosophical Perspectives on Inter- and Transdisciplinarity, Webinar, ITD Alliance & INSciTS, online, 22 January 2025**

The International Network for the Science of Team Science ([INSciTS](#)) and the Global Alliance for Inter- and Transdisciplinarity ([ITD Alliance](#)) are partnering to host a webinar series in the spirit of both organizations' interests in pursuing a deeper understanding of collaborations across different disciplines. The upcoming webinar "Philosophical Perspectives on Inter- and Transdisciplinarity: Pluralism, Reflexivity, and Critique" will be held online on January 22, 2026 as a panel discussion followed by Q&A and conversation.

One century after interdisciplinarity's inception, in 2025, *Issues in Interdisciplinary Studies* published a special issue on the [Philosophy of Interdisciplinarity](#). Despite the growing significance of interdisciplinarity, especially in the last 50 years, philosophical engagement with it has been limited. This issue offers contemporary contributions by authors from countries around the world with themes representing perspectives on the plurality of interdisciplinary research (IDR). The webinar panel brings together a subset of contributors from that special issue. Coeditors Machiel Keestra and Jan Schmidt will offer a brief introduction to the special issue. Schmidt then will introduce his concept of "critical-reflexive interdisciplinarity". Bethany Laursen will discuss a new conceptual and visual tool known as "integrative topologies". Keestra finally discusses his ideas on epistemic injustice, resistance, and openness in IDR. Moderated by Stephen Fiore, the webinar closes with a shared conversation on the benefits and challenges of philosophy of interdisciplinarity for IDR.

The [Foundations of Inter- and Transdisciplinary Research \(FITR\)](#) PhD course will take place over six consecutive workdays on the Wageningen University campus, in Wageningen, The Netherlands. The course involves six ITD Alliance members: Jillian Student (course developer, instructor), Nikki Brand, Anne Bruggen, Anke de Vrieze, Gemma O'Sullivan, Mareike Smolka (contributing lecturers). ## Survey by member institution

**Transdisciplinary Education Integrating Technology, Arts & Humanities, Survey, TransINNOVATE/TAH Centre, Deadline 16 January 2026**

The [TAH Centre](#), an ITD Alliance institutional member, is conducting international research on transdisciplinary education for the future-ready competencies. Two months ago, they launched [TransINNOVATE](#) – a €250,000 Erasmus+ project bringing together partners from the Czech Republic, Slovenia, Lithuania, and Germany. The goal is to create the first systematic framework for transdisciplinary education at the intersection of technology, arts, and humanities.

The needs analysis survey invites educators, researchers, artists, and educational managers or designers from Europe and beyond working at disciplinary intersections crossing new technologies (AI (artificial intelligence), robotics, VR (virtual reality), NFT (non-fungible token), QC (quantum computing), etc.), art of all kinds, and social & cultural & environmental impact - to share their experiences through a 20-minute anonymous survey. The input directly shapes: training programmes, AI-enhanced tools, methodological frameworks, and micro-credentialing standards.

## Analyzing Knowledge Integration in Convergence Research, Online, 14 January 2026

This event is part of the U.S. [National Science Foundation's Growing Convergence Research](#) Lecture Series. Join Shalini Misra, Ph.D., Associate Professor, School of Public and International Affairs, Virginia Tech, USA for her discussion of how researchers charged with leading convergence research might better plan, design, implement, and evaluate the integrative processes and products of their research. She will: (1) present an analytical framework to examine knowledge integration processes and products; (2) describe how they applied the framework to assess knowledge integration processes and products during the first two years of a five-year National Science Foundation Growing Convergence Research (GCR) project using a self-evaluation approach; and (3) consider the efficacy of the various knowledge integration approaches used in their GCR project and share empirically derived recommendations for designing, implementing, and evaluating convergence research. In addition to exploring strategies for responding to global challenges, the program focuses in particular on five pressing challenges: Global Health, Social Cohesion, Climate and Water under Change, Quantum Technologies, and Responsible Innovation in Times of Transformation.
