Description

This talk brings together an Indigenous iTaukei (Fijian) practitioner, Adi Vasulevu Merewalesi Levu, and a Brazilian scientist based in Australia, Leo Dutra, to reflect on how meaningful community engagement creates the foundation for long-term relationships through their experiences working across the Pacific. Through shared stories and practical lessons from their extensive collaboration since 2016, they will discuss what it takes to build partnerships that are grounded in trust, reciprocity, and local priorities—moving beyond short-term projects toward sustained collaboration. The speakers will explore how Indigenous knowledge and scientific approaches can complement one another, leading to effective impacts and will offer reflections on what respectful, enduring partnerships can look like in practice for communities, researchers, and institutions working in the region. Moderation will be by Giedre Kligyte of the Transdisciplinary School at the University of Technology Sydney. This hour-long webinar will be followed by a 30-minute open discussion – a Talanoa – where you can connect with others across Oceania who are passionate about inter- and transdisciplinarity. Speakers

Adi Vasulevu Merewalesi Levu is an Indigenous woman from Vanua Levu, Fiji and co-founder of two peacebuilding organizations: the Pacific Center for Peacebuilding, established in 2007, and Transcend Oceania, founded in 2014. She served as Executive Director of Transcend Oceania from 2017 to 2025 and continues to serve in a transitioning coordination position. Adi has more than 20 years of experience as a dedicated practitioner in peacebuilding, network-strengthening, community mediation and partnerships grounded in Indigenous relational practices and restorative justice, trauma-informed community healing and human dignity. Her work spans Fiji, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu, Tonga, Samoa, and Bougainville (PNG). Her initiatives embracing western and local concepts with traditional knowledge have established relevant partnerships and working relationships with peacebuilding institutes, scientist groups, and Indigenous local leaders working together for sustainable peace and positive relationships. Adi's regional and global engagements include leadership roles with GPPAC Pacific and the Shifting the Power Coalition, reflecting her commitment to strengthening Pacific coalitions and translating community knowledge into policy and systems change. Dr Leo Dutra is a Senior Research Scientist with the Fisheries Assessment and Marine Ecology Team at CSIRO Oceans & Atmosphere, working at the nexus of marine resources and people. His transdisciplinary research centres on co-designing applied science with government and non-government partners, industry, and First Nations peoples to support sustainable marine livelihoods and resilient ocean industries. Leo has partnered with practitioners and communities across Australia (including Commonwealth fisheries, Torres Strait, Kakadu, and the Great Barrier Reef) and internationally in the Pacific, with recent work on blue carbon livelihoods in Fiji and food system transformation in Kiribati and Solomon Islands. Across these settings, Leo focuses on governance, climate impacts, and adaptation in socio-ecological systems, often requiring careful translation between scientific methods and local cultural worldviews.
